Graham his wife, witnesses, that in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars paid us by James American Graham of Queen Anne's County the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged. Now in consideration of the foregoing premises, the said James C. Graham and Rachel S. Graham his wife do grant and convey unto the said James American Graham one half interest in that tract of a lot of land situate in the village of Beverdam or Engleside, which is contained within the following metes and bounds, to wit: Beginning forty six and a half feet west of a Stone planted in the public road leading from Beverdam or Engleside to Templeville, said Stone being the beginning for the lot known as the "Williams Lot"; and running thence north fifteen perches and eight tenths of a perch where it intersects the divisional line between the "Williams Lot"; and the lands of Benjamin Wilson
